Elisheva Karol (25), otherwise known as Ellie, is a beginner surfer and business development consultant at Louis Karol Architects






After she was involved in a pedestrian accident last year (2018), the doctors were forced to perform an above knee amputation

Ellie concentrating as she practises using her relatively new prosthetic limb while walking over hurdles






"I can be just as strong as someone else, I can be even stronger than them" (Alwyn)





